SUBJECT: 20TH OF NOVEMBER TO 10TH OF DECEMBER 2024: OBSERVATION OF

THE ANNUAL 20 DAYS OF HUMAN RIGHTS ACTIVISM CAMPAIGN

This Circular Instruction serves to inform all Departmental Heads, Provincial Administrators and Heads of Agencies on the observation and the commemoration of the annual 20 Days of the Human Rights Activism Campaign in the public service that commences on the 20th of November and ends on the 10th of December, 2024.

The Official Launching of the 20 Days of Human Rights Activism Campaign

The "20 Days of the Human Rights Activism Campaign" (2DHRAC) in the country is part of the global movement that began with the "16 Days of Activism Against Gender – Based Violence". The United Nations Secretary – General launched in 2008 the campaign **UNITE by 2030 to End Violence Against Women**, which runs parallel to the 16 Days of Activism.

In the National Public Service, the 20 days of the human rights activism campaign is observed through various agency's GESI Help Desks under the Public Service Male Advocacy Network program. This program aims to work with and for women to raise awareness and advocate for the human rights of women and girls in the workplaces, homes and communities.

The Department for Community Development & Religion is the mandated agency in the implementation and coordination of the 20DHRAC in the country. The department will

officially launch the 2024 campaign on Friday 14^{th} of November 2024 in West New Britain Province.

The event will see participation from political leaders, heads of various departments, government representatives, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), international entities, donor partners, community-based organizations (CBOs), and members of the general public.

The 2024 -2025 National Theme

Every year, the UNITE Campaign focuses on a specific theme and this year's **international theme** is "Act Now! End Violence Against Women & Girls". This theme underscores the critical urgency of the moment and is built around three core pillars, aligned with UN Women's Beijing+30 engagement strategy: Accountability, Resourcing, and Recommitment to End VAWG. It emphasizes the critical need for accelerated action on ending violence against women and girls.

The national theme for 2024 to 2025 is "It's My Responsibility – Let's Work Together to Prevent All Forms of Violence."

The theme, "It's My Responsibility" stresses the importance of personal ownership in addressing violence. It challenges individuals to break cycles of violence within their families and communities, encouraging everyone to take action. At the same time, "Let's Work Together" reflects the need for coordinated efforts across all sectors of society, reinforcing PNG's cultural value of collective action and support.

"It's My Responsibility – Let's Work Together to Prevent All Forms of Violence" serves as a strong call to action for 2024 to 2025. It highlights that preventing violence is a shared duty, demanding both personal commitment and collective effort. As Papua New Guinea approaches its 50th anniversary of independence, this theme brings a message of hope and unity, motivating the nation to strive for a future free from violence.
